They were curious, inquisitive and enjoyed talking to teachers and other students during Open House.

I want to really thank and acknowledge Pat Wong, immediate past PTO president for helping put this all together. Many parents volunteered their time to make or bring food and help with the luncheon setup. The administration expressed their appreciation and gratitude towards the wonderful parents of MHS for their overwhelming generosity. The Grad night parents have been hard at work raising money for the graduating Senior students for the 2008 Grad Night celebration. MEASURE M UPDATE

Results of the repackaging of the Measure M projects were Presented during the District Board meeting on March 13. District wide, the security locks will be installed beginning February 2008. The air conditioning and Main Field projects will begin in June 2008 with the swimming pool renovation beginning in June 2009. At mills, the new classroom building will begin April 2009. Completion of Building A will begin June 2009. HVAC piping and controls will begin June 2010. Theatre and gym renovation will begin June 2001. Civil improvement will begin June 2001. The total funding for these five projects is \$45.7 million.

Principal's Message

Paging through the schedule of events still to come, it is hard to believe that the end of the school year is just around the corner. With less than six weeks remaining before final exams and Graduation, Mills will be a hive of activity. Between class expectations and homework, Advanced Placement testing, and end of year activities, it is critical our students are supported and encouraged to find balance between their academic and personal responsibilities.

Through the month of May, I hope you will have an opportunity to see our students perform in the annual Mills Talent Show, Spring Concert, or Spring Musical, *Homework*. The Spring season is also active for our student athletes with weekly games and matches as part of the Peninsula Athletic League. In addition to these student performances and contests, the month of May will also include Senior Awards Night, the Hall of Fame Dinner, and of course, Graduation. Although each of these activities is different and unique, they provide a true insight to the quality and character of our students and the dynamic nature of our school community. As we look forward to our end of year activities and celebrations, I would also like to recognize one of our more recent successes. Over Spring Recess, the Mills jazz band, symphonic band, and jazz choir (49 students in all) participated in the Heritage Music Festival in Anaheim, CA winning first place honors in Jazz band and Symphonic band and a second place in Jazz choir. Additionally, the Jazz band received the adjudicator's award and was recognized as the best instrumental group in the competition. Congratulations to Music Director Ken Crowell and to all the students who participated in the festival.

In preparation for next year, students have been meeting with counselors over the past month to review course selections and to plan their academic schedule for the 2008-2009 school year. Each student has submitted a course request form to assist counselors and administration in developing course offerings for next year. Ninth and tenth graders are required to enroll in classes that meet the academic core which fulfill initial college entrance requirements for the University of California and California State University systems. Mills will continue to offer the 7 period day to provide additional support and opportunities for students to take support, art, world language, and elective offerings. Before the end of the year, please review your student's selections to ensure a rigorous but appropriate course load. Again, if you have any questions, please contact your student's counselor.

The intelligence, talent, and hard work of our student body never fails to amaze and inspire me. In this final edition of the Viking Voice for the 2007-08 school year, I would again like to thank the Mills Parent Teacher Organization for their consistent support throughout the school year. I would also like to recognize the efforts of the Music and Athletic Booster clubs in supporting these truly vital programs. Last, I would like to thank the many parents who have contributed their support to the benefit of our many programs here at Mills High School. Although the conversation surrounding how to best educate and prepare our students for post high school challenges will continue, Mills is committed to working with all stakeholders to provide an exceptional education and academic experience for all our students.

A BIG thanks to Mike Toshack, who has stepped in while Ken Crowell has been out on sick leave. Mr. Crowell wears some pretty big shoes, but Mike Toshack is no little foot. Without Mr. Toshack's sacrifice and contribution, the music program would not have been where it is now.

The Mills Spring Concert will be on Thursday May 8th, and will feature all of Mills' music groups. A free Mills Music Car Wash will be held on April 26th. Last but not least, the musical, "Homeroom" will be held on the dates May 15, 16, 17, and 18.

Mills International Assembly

Cultural pride, school spirit, student leadership, diversity, and talent—all came together in an outstanding and very entertaining event Mills last month as the school held its annual International Assembly. Presented twice during the morning, the assembly featured many wonderful performances of music and dance from different cultures, along with a performance by the school's dance class. This assembly has been presented annually for over a decade—you might want to watch for it next year, and attend if you can.

Every group went to the time and effort to dress in traditional clothing, displaying a lively array of fabrics, colors and styles. First, I enjoyed a melodic duet performed on Chinese zithers. A variety of other wonderful performers followed, including members of the Indian Club in jewel-colored costumes performing dances from different regions of India, and a group of over a dozen students from the Filipino American Alliance performing dances that included rhythmic jumping over long sticks. Other performances (not an exhaustive list) included Polynesian and Greek dances, a Korean percussion performance, Latina dances with participants in colorful costumes and shiny spiked headdresses, Irish dancing, and a modern Chinese song.

The variety of performances represented many of the cultural backgrounds at Mills, and was both enjoyable and a great introduction to a variety of cultural music and dance. The assemblies truly gave life to the concept that music is an international language that can help promote respect and understanding. I'm glad time was made for this type of programming in the school day.

There were two "grand finales." First, the Mills dance class—some three dozen students—brought their energy to the stage with dancing to the music of "Hairspray," including break dancing, gymnastics, and the classic '60's mashed potato. The program ended with its own tradition—Polynesian dancers running down the aisles and onto the stage for a final performance.

I enjoyed seeing the excellent student talent—as well as the respect and enthusiasm of the students in the audience. See it for yourself if you can next spring—it's really a great morning at Mills!

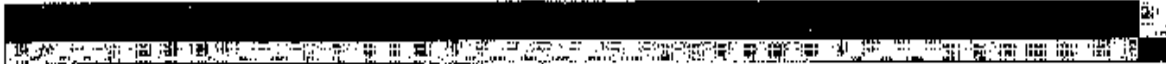

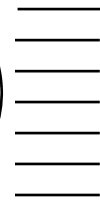
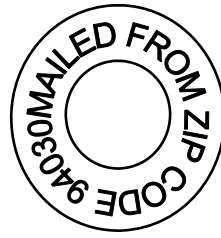
